Dr. Robert O. Cotes will serve as the guest speaker for this broadcast, presented by the Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers Behavioral Science Division. Dr. Cotes is an Associate Professor at Emory University School of Medicine in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences. He serves as Director of the Clinical & Research Program for Psychosis at Grady Health System, Atlanta, Georgia, and as Physician Expert for the Serious Mental Illness Adviser Initiative, which provides evidence-based resources to clinicians, individuals with serious mental illness, and their families. Dr. Cotes is a 2022 recipient of the NAMI Exemplary Psychiatrist Award. This broadcast is hosted by Senior Instructor (SI) Todd Rhodes. SI Rhodes has 28 years of sworn law enforcement experience, retiring as a Lieutenant with the Savannah Police Department. SI Rhodes coordinates the Behavioral Science Division's Mental Health Crisis Instructor Training Program (MHCITP) and the Psychologically Speaking Broadcast. SI Rhodes also serves as a peer supporter.
