# Chief of Police Brush Police Department

The Chief of Police will command an outstanding team of 10 sworn Police Officers, one CSO, one Office Manager, one Municipal Court Clerk, and one Cadet. The Police Dept has an operating budget of \$1.2 million and is divided into two major divisions – Investigations and Patrol. Dispatch communications and Justice Center services are provided by Morgan County government. The Brush! animal shelter is also operated by Brush PD. Community policing strategies are highly valued in this small city.

Anticipated focus areas for the Chief are: Proactive and Community Oriented Policing, Maintaining Police Policies and Procedures, Enhancing Municipal Court Administrative Operations, Improving Emergency Management Planning and Coordination, Maintaining a best practices standard in all operations, and implementing an ICS training program.

The Chief of Police for the Brush Police Department directs, coordinates, and oversees all department procedures, practices and activities. Some of the qualities we are looking for in the new Chief include:

- Demonstrates and maintains the highest level of ethics, integrity, and accountability and leads by example
- · Demonstrates strong communication, management, interpersonal, and organizational skills
- Is visible, accessible, transparent, and engaged in community policing strategies
- Is committed to and active within the community and community organizations
- Demonstrates high level of cross departmental coordination and communication
- Ensures fair and impartial enforcement of Federal, State, and local laws

#### **Oualifications:**

- Certified as a peace officer under the guidelines of the Colorado Peace Officer Standards and Training Board
- Bachelor degree from an accredited institution with major course work in criminal justice, public safety, public administration or related field required
- Minimum of 10 years of progressively responsible experience in law enforcement, including 3 years of experience in a command level leadership position such as Lieutenant required or a combination of education, experience and training totaling 10 years which provides requisite knowledge, skills and abilities for the position will be considered on a case by case basis
